Aims of the CRE

- To find ways to improve knowledge exchange between researchers and end-users
- To build capacity in health workforce research

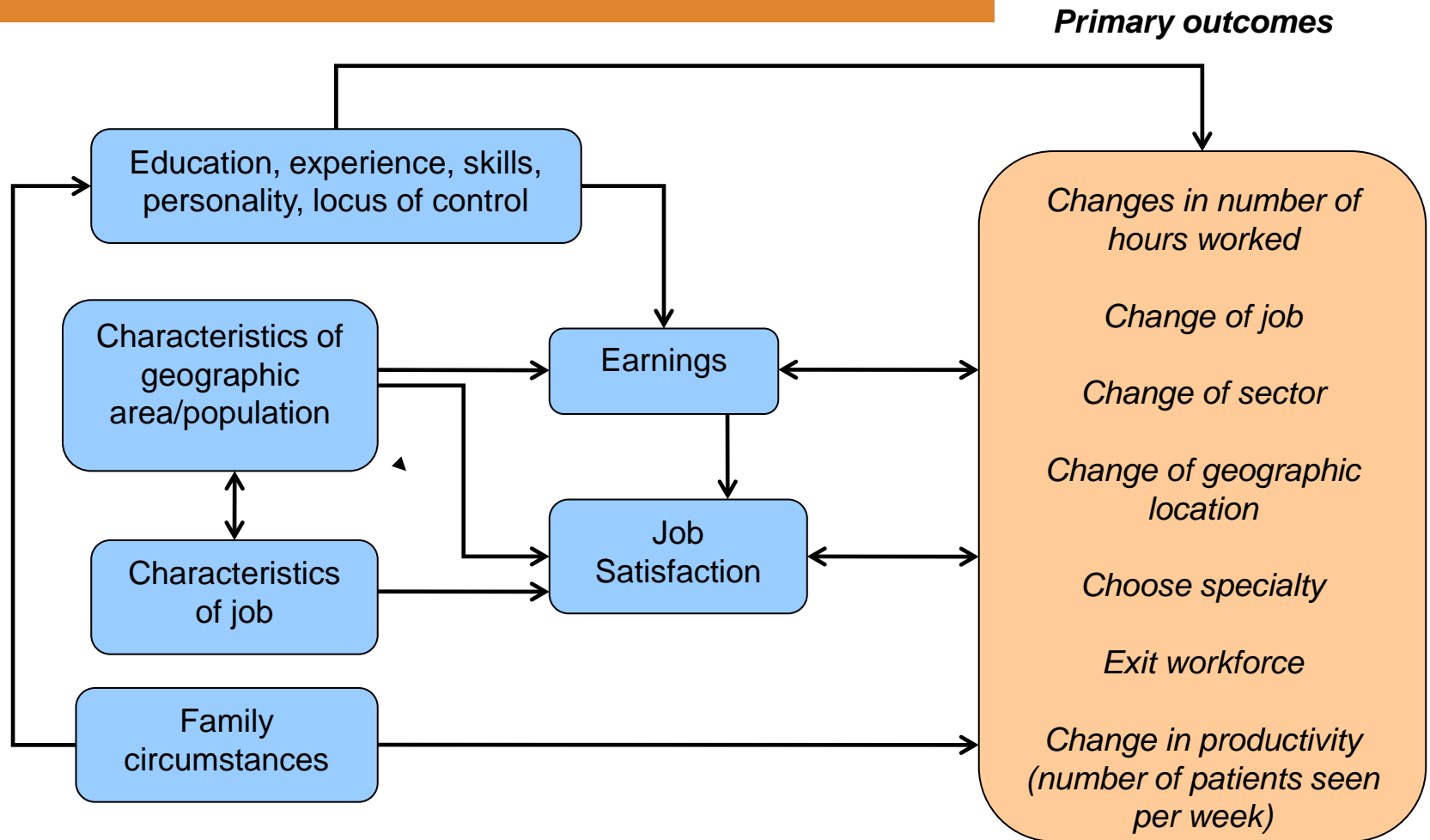
Funding

- 2007-2011. NHMRC Health Services Research Grant. \$2.1m
- 2012-2016. NHMRC Centre of Research Excellence, \$2.49m
- Additional funding from Department of Health (in 2008) and HWA (in 2013)
- Nine annual waves of the MABEL Survey
- 2 FTE research fellows

Why a survey?

- Not about counting or describing
- Interested in understanding *why* doctors make labour supply decisions
 - Essential for policy design
 - Association  Causality
 - Need a range of information
 - Need a panel / longitudinal survey

MABEL Conceptual Framework

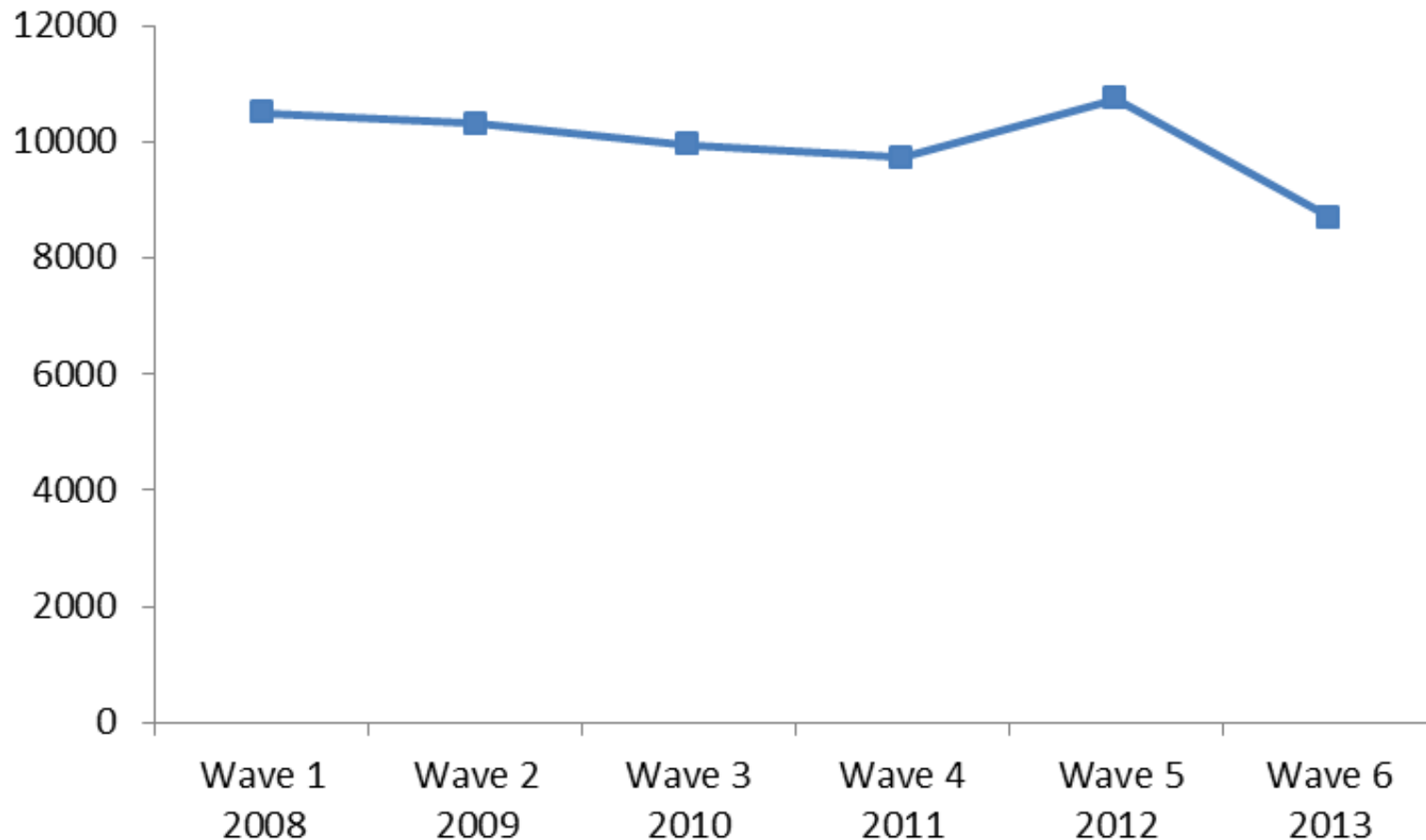

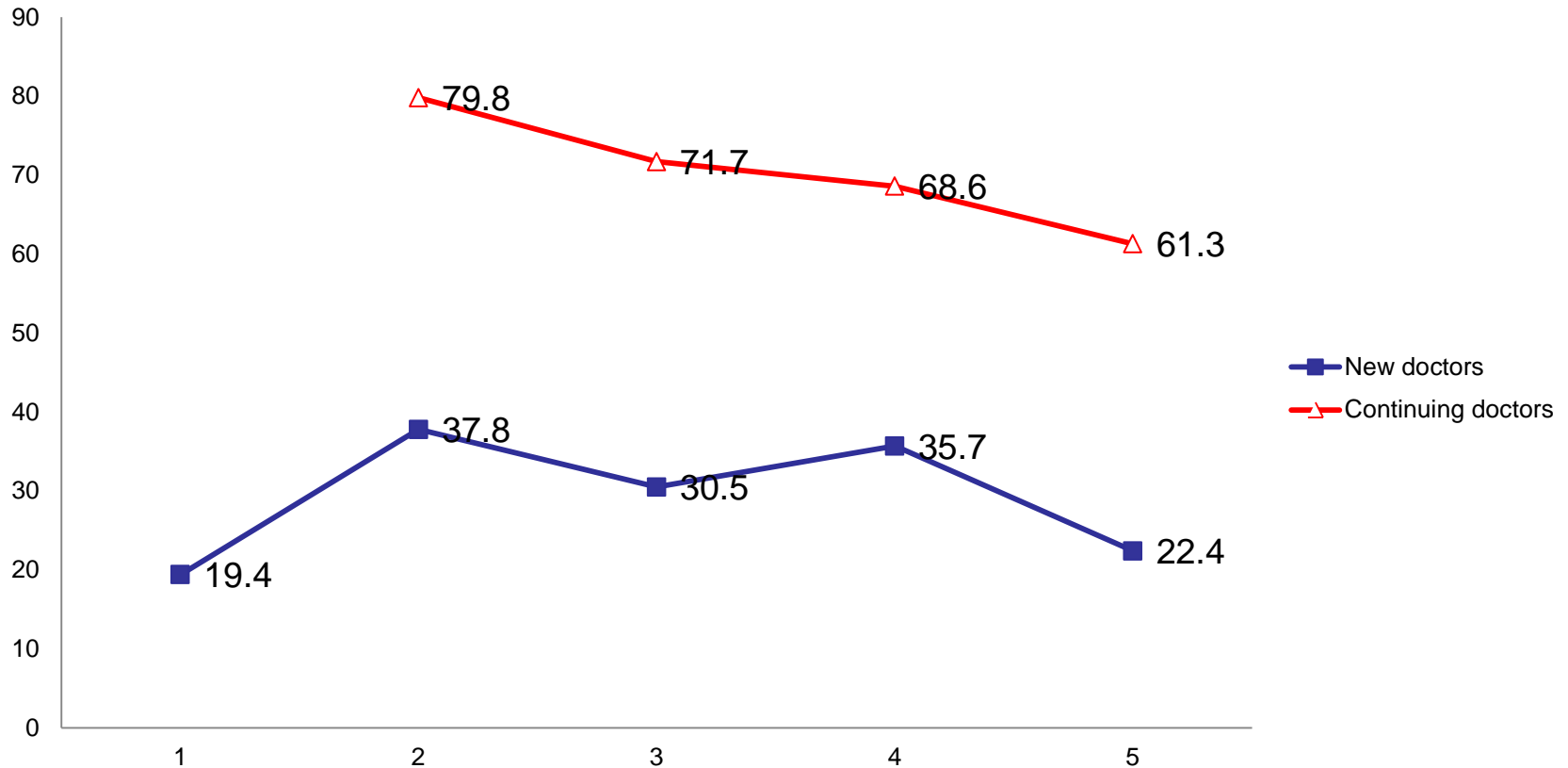


Number of respondents

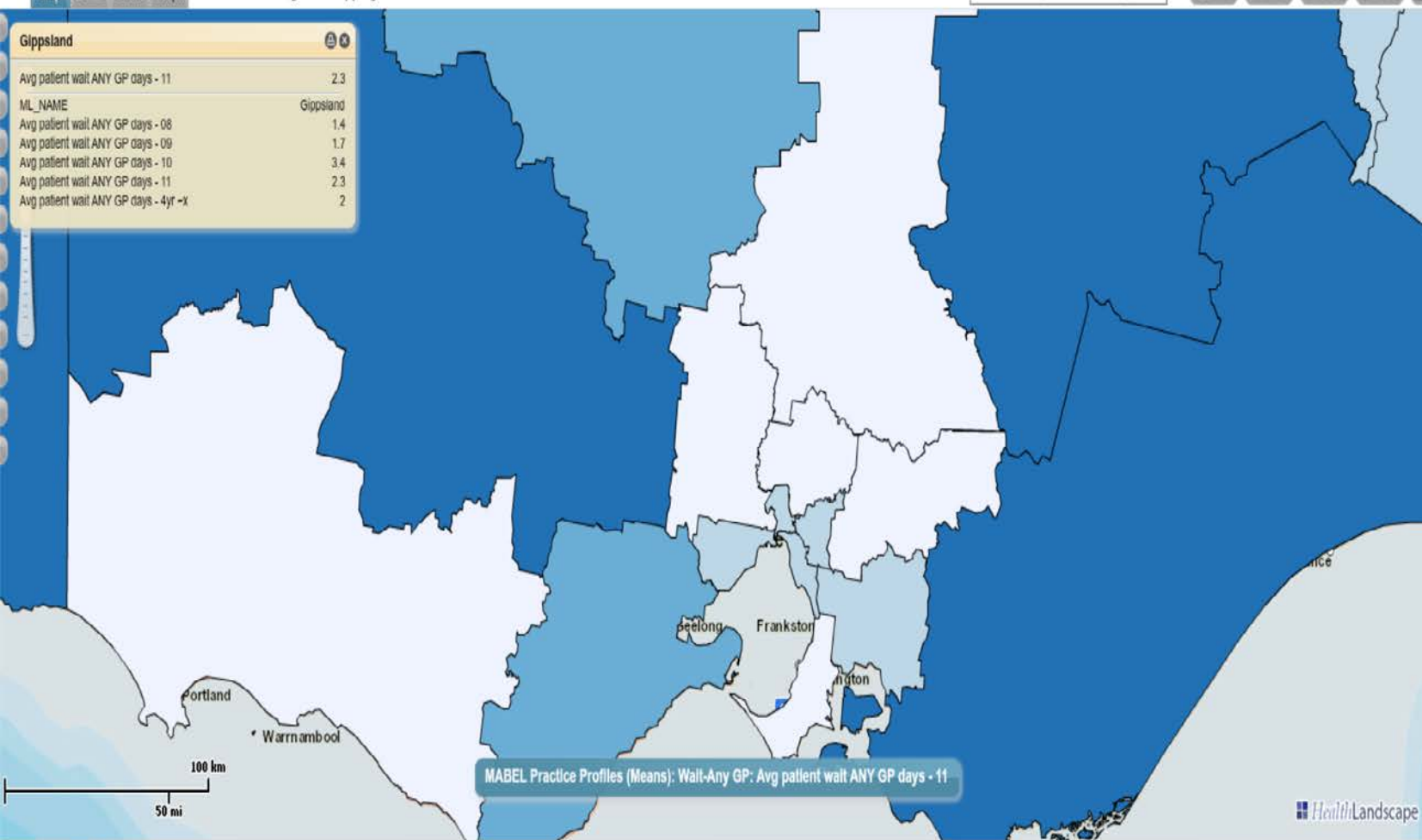
